Geographical knowledge and skills needed for transition from KS1 into KS2...

Locational Knowledge

1. Name and locate all seven continents and five major oceans on a world map.
2. Name and locate the four countries of the United Kingdom and their capital cities.
3. Identify characteristics of the UK, including surrounding seas, main rivers, mountain ranges, climate and landmarks

Place Knowledge

1. Compare the similarities and differences of geographical features of Stalybridge to a small area of a non-EU country
terms: physical and human (in relation to landscape, buildings, climate)
terms: similar, different, in common

Human and Physical Geography

1. Recognise weather patterns
2. Recognise seasonal changes in the weather in the UK
3. Know hot and cold areas in relation to the equator, including the North and South Poles
4. Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical features, including: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season, weather
5. Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key human features, including: city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour, shop

Geographical Skills and fieldwork

1. Use world maps, atlases and globes to locate UK and non-UK countries
2. Use simple compass directions: north, south, east and west
3. Use simple locational and directional language: near, far, left, right, in front of, behind
4. Use oblique and aerial photographs
5. Devise a simple map using symbols and a key
6. Use first hand observation to tally data in the field
