	We support the children to recall the rhythm and rhyme they learnt in Nursery. The children will be encouraged to join with the repeated refrains.		The children will learn all about light sources and changes throughout the day and night. They will also learn about shadows and how they are created.
	The children will be thinking about similarities and differences between themselves and their friends. They will paint and draw self-portraits by looking in a mirror and observing their features.		This story introduces the children to suspense and encourages them to predict what will happen next. The text develops descriptive vocabulary that invites the children to join with repetitive refrains.
	The children will be learning about their emotions and will be introduced to the Zones of Regulation. This will support their understanding that emotions change and what they can do to regulate and feel better about things.		This book introduces the children to a range of exotic animals and their features. It also encourages them to think about being happy with who they are.
	The children will begin to think about friendships and how they can resolve differences beginning to think about another person's point of view.		The children learn about the changes in the seasons and hibernation through the eyes of an owl who lives in the tree. It also introduces them to a range of woodland creatures and their habitats.
	The children will be thinking about similarities and differences between their own and other's families. We will talk about who they live with and their wider family.		The children will learn about colour mixing primary to secondary colours. They will also learn about accepting differences such as culture or race.
	The children will be thinking about helping others, working as a team and how things are easier when they pull together.		The children will learn about the importance of goodness, loyalty and courage. The story also highlights the significance of family and the power of love, devotion and the beliefs of other cultures.
			This story supports the children to learn about gratitude, friendship and the spirit of giving. It's origin is based upon a gesture of peace when Norway gifted a Christmas tree to the UK.
